

Opening lesson: Needs and Where They Fit.

1. Where would they fit into his hierarchy and why?

-On the bottom of the pyramid sits the most essential biological needs such as water and sunlight. These are the basic, fundamental things needed for survival.

-On the next level, there are emotional essence such as self respect and support.

These things were put in the next level in the pyramid because they are quite important too

-The third level includes love and friendship, which are essential emotional qualities of survival as well. However, these are not entirely mandatory.

-The fourth column on top consists of car, money, and procreation. Although some might disagree, these are surely not essential for human survival, so they were put on top.
