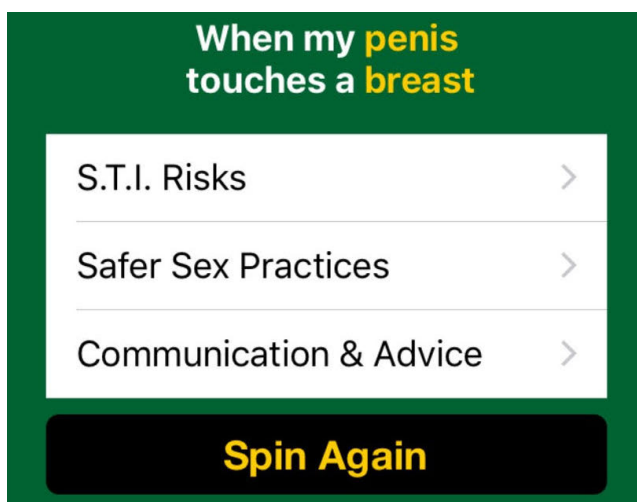
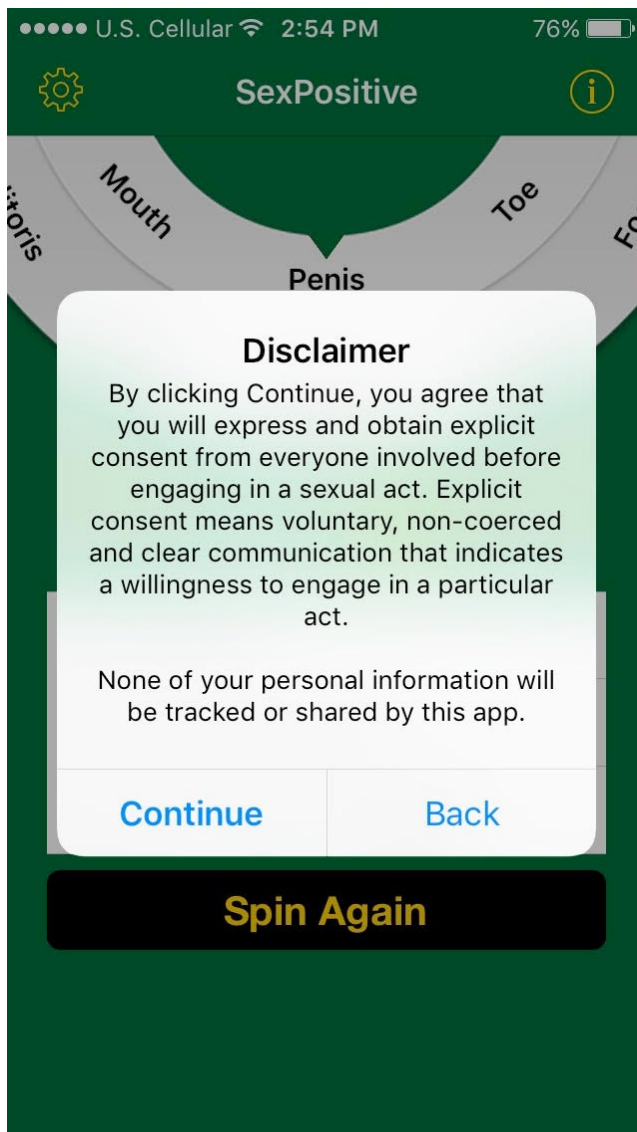
Ducks talk about sex...kind of
