Lesson Title: The Journey of Oliver K. Woodman

Short Term Goal:

Write a friendly letter. Develop map skills and become more familiar with landforms.

Direct Explanation/Model

Five Sessions

What:

We are going to participate in activities that will develop comprehension skills, develop skills that will enable students to write a friendly letter, and explore geographical concepts.

Why:

We will be able to link Literacy and Social Studies concepts by developing reading and writing skills and explaining geographical concepts related to the book *The Journey of Oliver K Woodman* by Darcy Pattison.

How:

We will read and discuss *The Journey of Oliver K. Woodman* by Darcy Pattison.

First Session:

Using the Smartboard lesson slide 1-6 guide, read and discuss *The Journey of Oliver K. Woodman* by Darcy Pattison.

Second Session:

Using Smartboard lesson slide 7 and friendly letter Smartboard writing lesson, students will develop skills to write a friendly letter.

Third Session:

Using Smartboard lesson slide 8-9, students and teachers will collaborate on a friendly letter that will be sent to a relative explaining the Oliver K. Woodman project.

Fourth Session:

Using Smartboard lesson slide 10-12 and This Land is Your Land Smartboard lesson, students will develop map skills and such concepts as cardinal directions, relative location, compass rose, etc.

Fifth Session:

After reviewing regions from previous session, have students predict what the various places on Oliver K. Woodman's journey looked like. Then show those places using Google map link.
