## What is Te Kupu o te Wiki?

Te Kupu o te Wiki will introduce **50 new Māori words** to the nation over **50 weeks** – that's one new word a week over a year. After 50 weeks, New Zealanders will have 50 new Māori words in their vocab.

## How we'll do it

Each week we'll present one new Māori word to 4 million New Zealanders to learn and use.

Write it, say it, email it, draw it – once learnt, everyone can keep using each word.

After 12 months, these 50 new Māori words can be used as a basis for building Māori language skills.

Te Kupu o te Wiki helps te reo Māori to grow in its homeland.

### What will language leaders do?


- > Invite friends, colleagues, whānau, businesses to get on board.

- > Enthusiasm to help others.

  - > Passion, let's make it normal to use te reo Māori at work, at home etc.
  - > Commitment e.g. finding a little time each week to pull the information together.

- > with the language, that's ok, invite Māori speakers to support you, or use our audio resources.
