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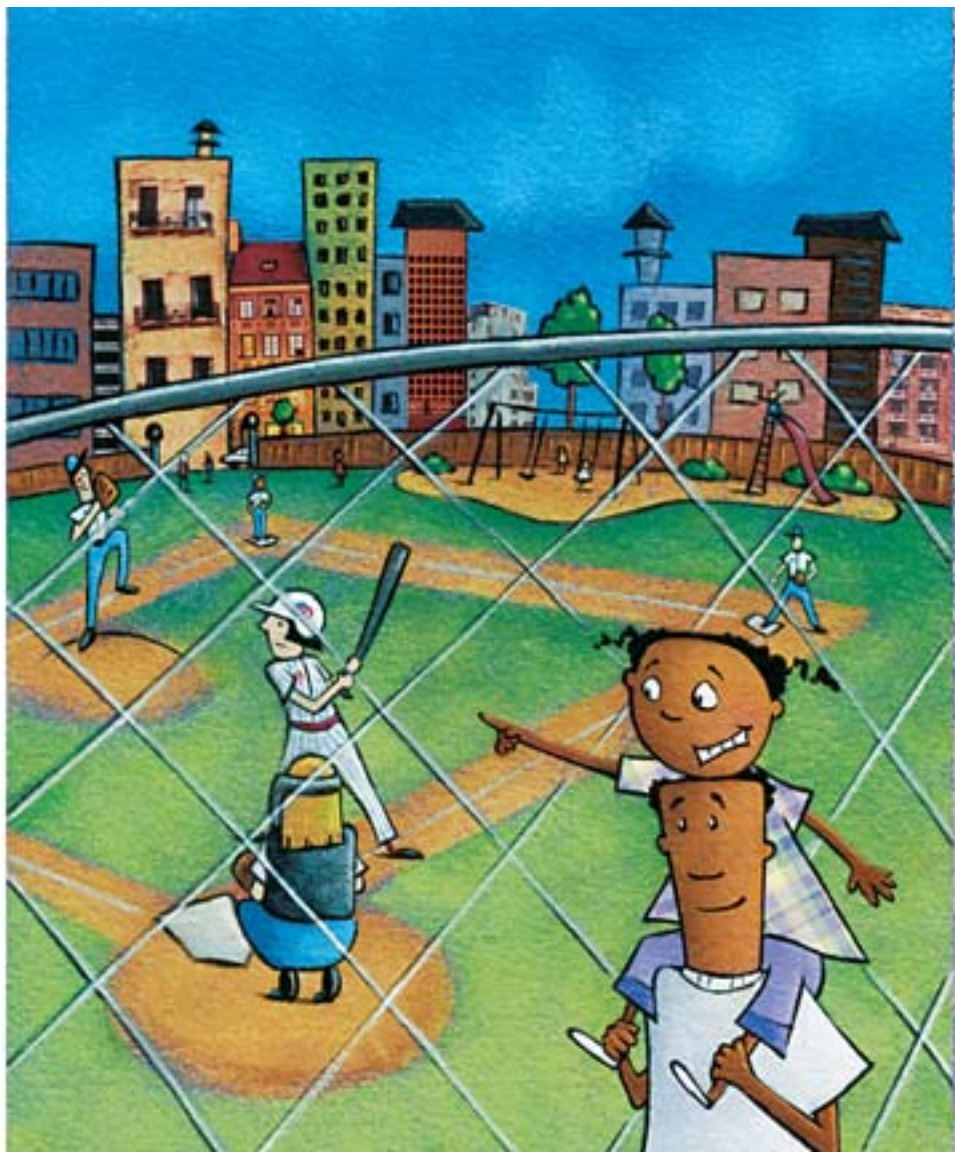
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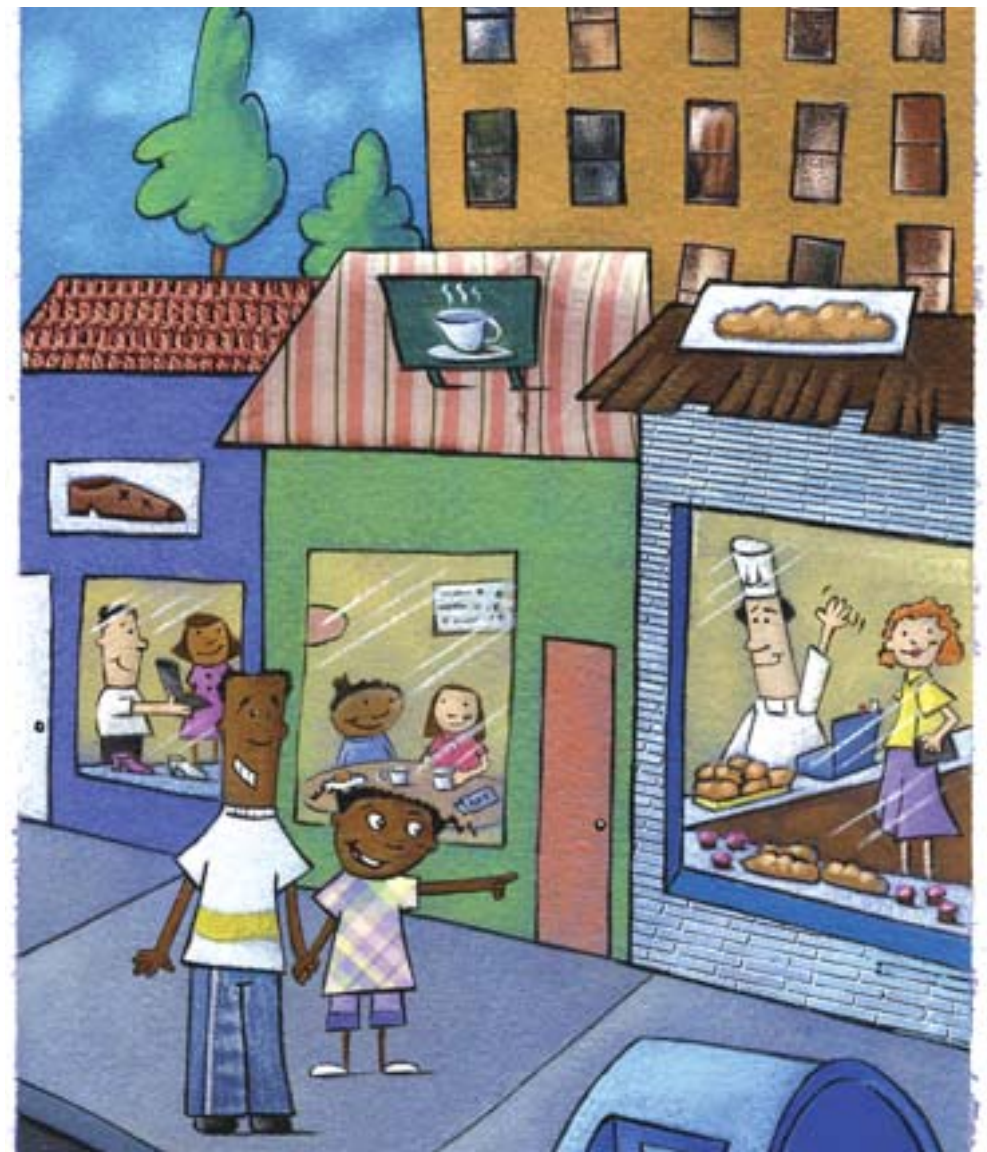


Here is my neighborhood.

People live and work here.



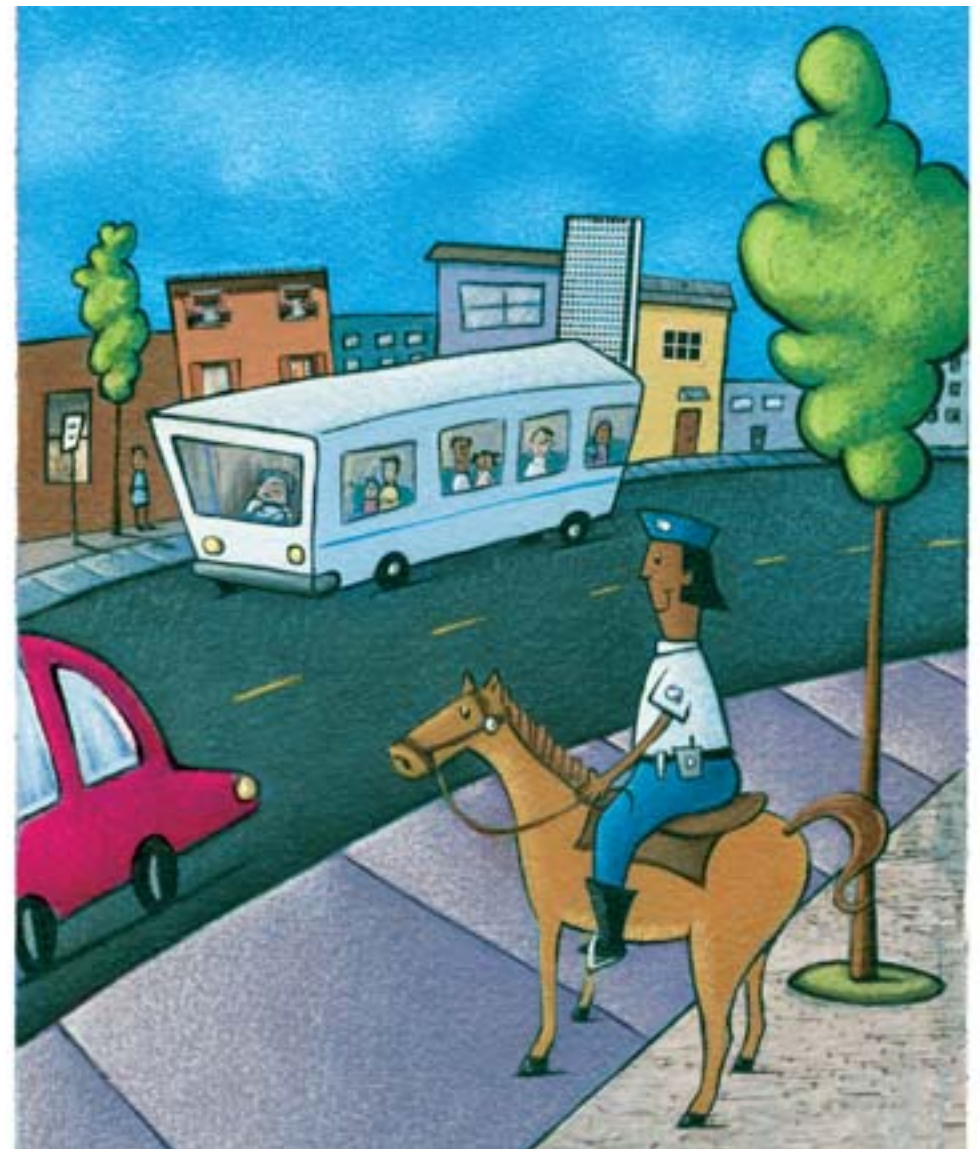
Who lives in my neighborhood?
