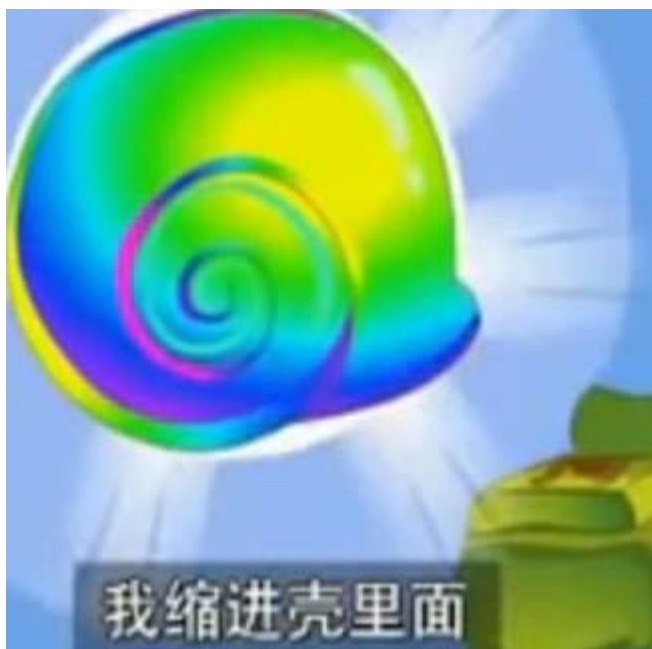

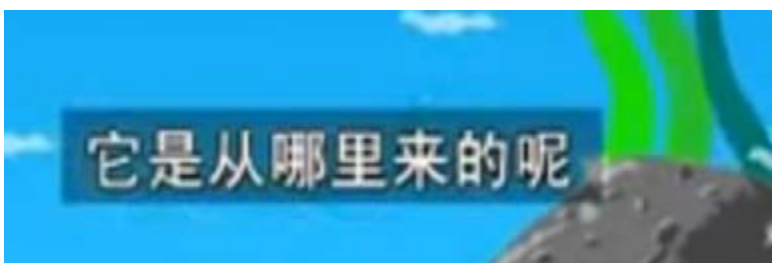

Snails can hit a top speed of one metre an hour, travelling the length of an average garden in a night, researchers have found.

Exeter University scientists also discovered they even move in convoy, piggy-backing on other snails' slime to save energy.

They examined the habits of 450 garden snails recording their movements using LED lights, UV paints and time-lapse photography.

This is the first time snails have been studied in this way, creating some unexpectedly spectacular images.

The findings revealed how snails will travel distances of up to 25 metres in a 24-hour period, and seek out areas of shelter, such as long grass, trees or objects, including dogs' toys, left in the garden overnight.

It is thought that a snail could use up to 30% of its energy in slime production alone, the study found.

Snails are at the bottom of most food chains, and near the outside of most food webs, so a lot of creatures like to eat them.

Many types of birds—especially water birds such as geese and gulls—like to eat snails. Some snakes eat snails, and so do some types of mammals such as raccoons, which like a meal of snails from time to time.

Some people even like to dine on snails. In fact, in the country of France, some types of snails are considered a *delicacy*—which means something very special and very good to eat.

As for, what do snails eat? They eat vegetation, including leaves.

Snails are a very common prey for many animals because they're extremely slow, making them an easy target. Because snails are small and easy to catch, it's common for larger predators, such as frogs, toads, snakes and birds, to eat many snails in one sitting. Snails are a popular target in shaded park areas where ducks and geese reside.

The snail's main defense mechanism is its shell. Although some animals are capable of breaking through the shell, the snail is often able to hide effectively from some predators in its shell. The snail's shell is also useful because it provides excellent camouflage in many areas.

Snails are a very important food source, and they help many species of animals to thrive. Although many are eaten, they mate several times a year and lay up to 100 eggs at a time, which keeps their populations strong in spite of their high mortality rate. Although humans consume millions of snails annually, most of those snails come from snail farms, so their numbers in the wild aren't affected.
