Grade Definitions

Prior to the final exam, the semester grades will be determined as follows:

**A:**

- No standard is below an M-.
- The homework quota is complete for at least one module per quarter.
- Either the MA average is E- or better, or all of the MA, MA.C, and MA.# averages are all M+ or better.

**B:**

- No standard is below an M-.
- The quota is complete for at least one module per semester.
- All of the MA, MA.C, and MA.# averages are M or better.
- The criteria for **A** are not met.

**C:**

- No standard is below an R.
- The MA.C is M or better.
- All of the MA.# averages are M- or better.
- The criteria for any higher letter grade are not met.

**D:**

- The MA average is M- or better.
- The criteria for any higher letter grade are not met.

**F:**

- The criteria for any higher letter grade are not met.

A student's final exam can only change their overall grade by at most one letter. If a student's performance on the final exam is better than the performance during the semester, then the semester grade increases by one letter. If a student's performance on the final exam is equal to or one letter grade below the performance during the semester, then the semester grade does not change. If a student's performance on the final exam is more than one letter grade below the performance during the semester, then the semester grade decreases by one letter.

For example, if a student has a C going into the final exam, then:

- If that student earns an A or a B on the final exam, then that student will have a B for the semester.
- If that student earns a C or a D on the final exam, then that student will have a C for the semester.
- If that student earns an F on the final exam, then that student will have a D for the semester.
