When Elephants Fight: The Lives of Children in Conflict in Afghanistan, Bosnia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, and Uganda

Annotation

(CORE, CAN) Five young people tell their stories about war. In the introduction, Kim Phuc sets the mood by talking about her experience as a child during the Vietnam War.

The countries include Uganda, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Sudan, Sri Lanka, and Afghanistan. Each individual story opens with the young person already surviving in the midst of the conflict. Each story includes the history of the country, the conflict, and a key point related to the story, such as child soldiers. At the end of each story, a box describes briefly what each person is doing now. For example, Annu leaves Sri Lanka and immigrates to Canada.

Teachers should note that some descriptions of the conflict and harm to people, while not graphic in detail, may disturb some readers.
