### Use of Socratic Questions

Dialogue does not make use of Socratic Questions.	0
Dialogue makes use of Socratic Questions to explore the topic.	1

### Justification of claims

Claims made but logical reasons are not given.	0
Logical reasons are given.	1

### Use of evidence

No evidence is provided to support the claims made.	0
General personal experience or opinion is used to support claims.	1
Observations/evidence from trails, community service, or other classes are used to support claims.	2
Observations/evidence from multiple parts of Galileo (trails, community service, other classes) are used together to support claims.	3

### Further Research

Argument does not incorporate any further research.	0
Argument also incorporates research from external sources (such as internet, library research, newspaper articles or discussions). Sources are clearly identified.	1

### Multiple Perspectives

Only one perspective on the theme/focus questions is considered.	0
The response considers more than one perspective.	1
The response considers more than one perspective and synthesises them into a coherent judgment or conclusion.	2

### Critical Reflection

No critical reflection made.	0
Some critical reflection is made. For example - evaluation of the strength or quality of the evidence, analysis of possible influence of stereotypes or bias in the evidence, or a suggestion of what might be missing or hidden from the evidence or argument.	1

### Expression and language use

Speakers are difficult to understand	0

### Structure

The dialogue is confusing in structure or jumps between unrelated points.	0
