Forgotten Beatles Songs: What makes a song a Beatles song? John Lennon and Paul McCartney had a prolific song-writing partnership in the 1960's and many of these are structurally very similar, even though the melodies may be very different. Listening to songs by other groups in the same period, you may say, "That sounds like a Beatles song," and you could well be right. The Lennon-McCartney team wrote songs for other groups and singers as well as themselves, though many of these non-Beatles songs have been long overlooked. Join this discussion of Lennon-McCartney songs and discover these forgotten gems.

The Kennedys: The Kennedys, Civil Rights, and the remaking and realignment of American politics. This presentation will stress the decisions made by John and Bobby Kennedy related to the Civil Rights movement, set against the background of both Kennedy's and Johnson's administrations. The discussion will culminate with an analysis of how the Democratic Party's decision set in motion a realignment of both political parties whose impact is felt today.

Printmaking: Print like a Pop Artist! Come by VAC 108 and participate in a Pop Art printmaking workshop. You will learn how to pull a print and mix bold colors with advertising logos for unique images, just like Andy Warhol would do!

Ceramics: Make groovy pottery! Come by the pottery studio and participate in a pottery making workshop where you will create pottery 60's style.

Cyanotypes: Come learn how to make cyanotypes, a simple photographic process that gives you blue prints. In the spirit of the 60s, we will be making designs with objects from that era. After placing the object on the coated paper, it is exposed in the sun. The silhouette of the object remains after rinsing.

Growing up in Post Segregation Alabama: Come see what it was like growing up in Selma, Alabama, in the first generation after the Civil Rights Movement as a member of the first class of students in town to attend integrated schools from grades K-12. This presentation will include as its starting point the 1965 Voting Rights March.
