

What did we do in the FWCD library last year?

School Year 2013-2014



Our volunteers shelved more than 900 books each.

We checked out 29,041 books. 596 of these were ebooks and 114 were audiobooks, but our 35 volunteers shelved the 28,445 print books that students read and returned.

29,041 books checked out? That is an average of 29 books per student.

We taught 1,081 classes, and we worked with Art, English, History, Math and Science teachers and students.



We subscribed to 27 library databases and online resources.



We brought in 4 FWCD authors to help celebrate our 50th anniversary. These authors spoke to 850 students in all divisions.



We sold over \$21,679 of books during our bookfair, and we delivered 400 books to Van-Zandt Guinn Elementary through our Books for Kids program.



We hosted 124 independent school librarians from all over the U.S. and Canada at a national conference.

We found out that 64.8% of our 5th and 6th grade students still prefer print books for recreational reading, so we offer both-- 33,508 print titles and 332 ebooks.



Summer 2014



We were open 3 hours every week so that students could check out books and take reading tests over their Summer Reading books. We checked out 3,457 books, of which 67 were ebooks.

FWCD Students and faculty read over 6,940 books this summer through our Summer Reading program.

We read stories and gave S'mores to 60 incoming kindergartners at Camp Read S'more, and we offered 2 summer camps.
