Remember that many places offer FREE field trips for teachers and students.

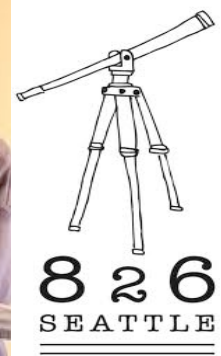

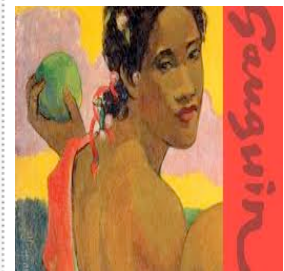
Dance at U Washington
