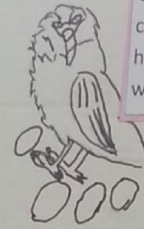


Wrybill

Where can you find the wrybill?

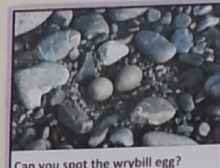
The wrybill lives in the south island on the rocky rivers.
