- Zach 3. He was Charlotte's best friend on board ship.
- Round Robin 4. It was a sign of a rebellion, designed so that no person's name was on the top or bottom of the list.
- a whip 5. Using this weapon, Charlotte inflicted a gash across Captain Jaggery's cheek.
- Mr. Cranick 6. He was shot by Captain Jaggery and thrown overboard without a proper service.
- Seahawk 7. It's figurehead was a hawk, with wings thrust back and a wide-open beak that appeared to be screaming.

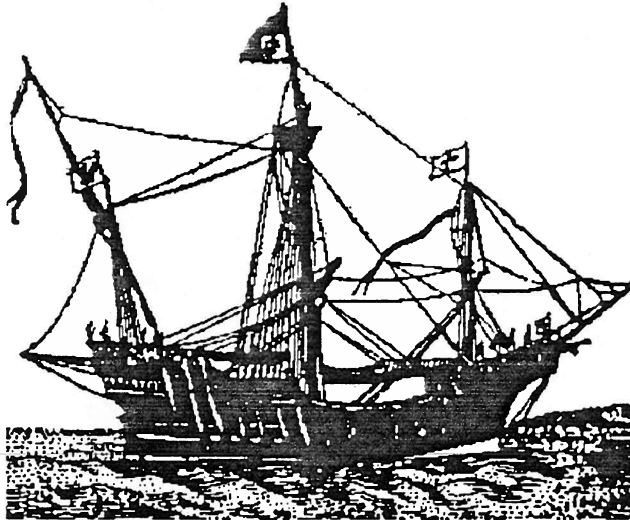
- drink 8. Zachariah gave Charlotte one of these soon after she came aboard and advised her to hide it under her mattress.

Mr. Hollybrass 25. He was the first mate and the only crewman who had not sailed with Captain Jaggery on the previous voyage.

Mr. Hollybrass 26. He disagreed with the captain's ways and argued with him.



Zach 27. He saved Charlotte's life during the fury of the hurricane.

Char. Father 28. He made Charlotte a prisoner in her own room and forbid her to talk about her voyage to her brother and sister.

Capt. Jaggery 29. At the beginning of the voyage, Charlotte thought he was a gentleman and wanted to please him.

Aug. 1832 30. The Seahawk reached Providence, Rhode Island on this date.

Zach 31. Both Mr. Hollybrass and Captain Jaggery beat him with a whip.

her journal 32. Charlotte's father gave it to her and instructed her to write in it daily during her voyage.

Char. father 33. The company he worked for owned the *Seahawk*.

Providence R.I. 34. Although she had been living in England since the age of six, Charlotte's true family home was here.

guns 35. The crew was not able to rebel against the captain because he had these.

Capt Jaggery 36. He murdered Mr. Hollybrass and accused Charlotte of the crime.

Liverpool Eng. 37. With Charlotte aboard, behaving as a proper young lady, the *Seahawk* sailed from this port to the United States.

hurricane 38. It was entered in the log that Captain Jaggery and Mr. Hollybrass were lost defending the ship during this.

- sailor's clothing 46. Zachariah made these for Charlotte.
- crew 47. They did not come forward to defend Charlotte during her trial because they believed they were protecting Zachariah.
- Capt Jaggery 48. He fell into the ocean and drowned while trying to kill Charlotte.
- hurricane 49. Captain Jaggery purposely tuned the *Seahawk* into it as a way to save time.
- Royal yard 50. Charlotte was standing under this when the *Seahawk* sailed away from Providence.
