

body





- JAMES I SON
- RULED AS ABSOLUTE MONARCH
- CATHOLIC
- DISAGREED WITH PARLIAMENT which led to the ENGLISH CIVIL WAR

ENGLISH CIVIL WAR-1642-1649

- **ENGLISH CIVIL WAR FOUGHT BETWEEN CHARLES I AND OLIVER CROMWELL (PARLIAMENTARIANS)**
- **CHARLES I –SUPPORTERS CALLED ROYALISTS/ CAVALIERS**
- **CROMWELL-SUPPORTERS CALLED ROUNDHEADS/PURITANS**
- ****PARLIAMENTARIANS (Cromwell) WIN**
- **1649-CHARLES I EXECUTED**

CROMWELL

- CROMWELL RULES THE GOVERNMENT-1649
- Calls himself “LORD PROTECTOR” of the COMMONWEALTH
- *He becomes an absolute ruler so when he dies*
- The people want to “restore” the monarchy-that means Charles II (Charles I son) as King.

RESTORATION

English Restoration-1660

The *Catholic King Charles II* (son Of Charles I) ruled.

- **James II becomes King**

- Parl. responds to James II by inviting Mary and her husband William of Orange to overthrow King James II
- James II flees to France
- William & Mary take over in what is known as the Glorious Revolution
