1) You and your partner will be Newspaper journalists reporting on your topic about WWI.
2) +-Means additional research from at least one of the books available and online research-Cite resources-NO WIKIPEDIA


3) You and your partner will Compile “notes” on paper-just as a journalist would do at the time


4) You must interview each other as an official “Source” and video each other

5) You will EACH write a newspaper article about your topic on long white paper to look like an actual newspaper article. You must name your newspaper and include an image-picture or cartoon. You can draw or print it out at home.

6) The final product is that you will present to students from other groups on Friday 3/11 with different topics as if you are in a journalist “press” room comparing stories from the war.

7) Must use the 5 W's and H-

---What are the Five Ws and One H? They are Who, What, Why, When, Where and How. Why are the Five Ws and One H important? Journalism purists will argue your story isn't complete until you answer all six questions. It's hard to argue this point, since missing any of these questions leaves a hole in your story.
