

Academic Integrity

In our TG agenda book under the heading of Academic Information there is a section regarding **academic integrity**, beginning at the bottom of page 13. If you have not read it, please do so today.

A dictionary definition of integrity would be “adherence to a code of values.” **One of the values that Totino-Grace teachers require is honesty.** Specific to my class this means that students **MAY NOT**: copy from another student’s homework or project; cheat in any way during a quiz or test; use an electronic translator on homework or projects (other than to look up *individual* words); have someone else write part or all of their homework or project.

The purpose of any assignment, quiz, or test is to practice new material or assess what students know or don’t know. Cheating prevents true learning and accurate assessment. **Please make it your goal to grow in knowledge, not just to get the grade.**

In the case that I become aware that cheating has occurred, a zero will be given, parents will be notified and you will be asked to meet with Ms. Michels or Ms. Broadhead.
