

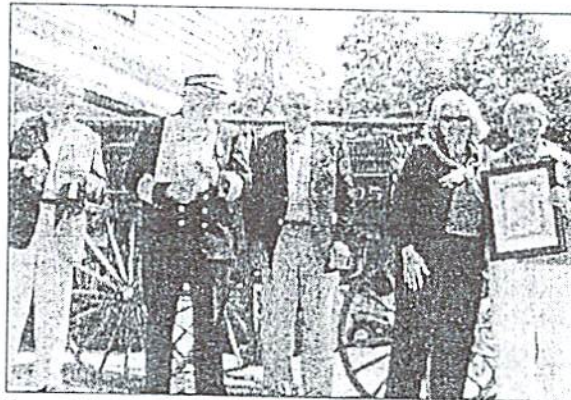
## Celebrating 100 Years of the Bluefish River Fire House

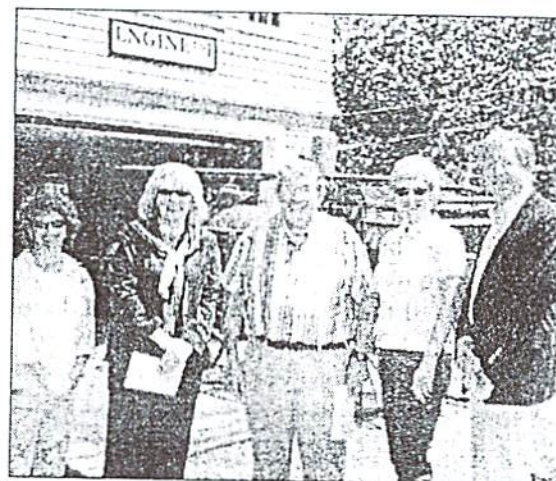


Barbara Kiley of the Steering Committee; John Baldwin, who remodeled the fire station; and Nancy Bennett, the restoration project steering committee leader.
