The Gurnet Bridge Company authorized by the legislature to build a bridge from Powder Point in Duxbury to Salter's Beach, have petitioned the County Commissioners to lay out the approaches and construct the bridge, subject to the conditions prescribed in the act. A hearing is to be given in Town Hall, in Duxbury, on the 25th day of April next at 10:15 o'clock, when all interested can appear and be heard. It is probable there will be little or no opposition to the project, which it is thought will be of much benefit to the town of Duxbury.

Wm. J. Wright, Esq., has received a letter from Hon. E.A. Morse, representative in Congress from this district, informing him that he should leave no stone unturned to procure an appropriation for Duxbury harbor. Mr. Morse appeared before the committee on Rivers and Harbors on Wednesday, the 12th inst, and advocated such a measure. In his letter he states that he expects to secure a life saving station at Duxbury, a preliminary survey of Kingston harbor with a view to its improvement, an appropriation for Plymouth. Cohasset, Nantasket Beach channel, Taunton and Weymouth River. Mr. Morse has already got a favorable report from the Committee on Commerce relative to the life saving station at Brant Rock, and the above work which he has laid out for himself shows that our congressman is not only a live individual, but the right man in the right place.
