The Plymouth County Charter Commission has held monthly meetings since it was formed in November, and late Monday night, Duxbury's representative on the commission updated selectmen on the progress that has been made.

Who represents Duxbury?

Duxbury resident Bill Harris, owner with his wife, Paula, of WH Cornerstone Investments, an investment advisory firm, was elected to represent the town on the 19-member Charter Commission studying what the future holds for Plymouth County. When asked what services Plymouth County provides to Duxbury, Harris explained that the county retirement plan benefits Duxbury.

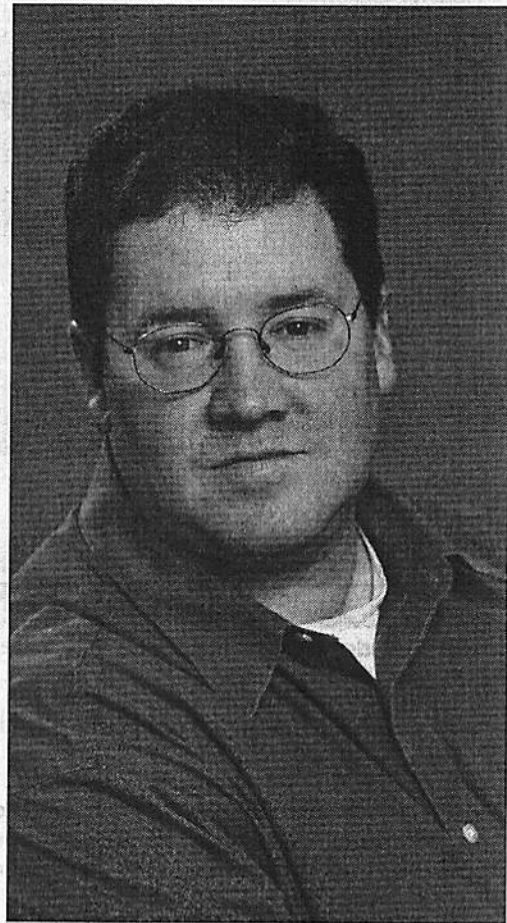
The role of the Plymouth County Charter Commission

Over the next year, the Charter Commission will consider whether to recommend maintaining the status quo, expanding the role of county government or abolishing county government. Five committees have been formed to complete this task. Any findings or recommendations would be placed on the 2012 ballot.
