Simcock, makes the following statement: He says, that years ago a kind of flat bottom sloop or a gundalow, called the Rosewood, with sailing facilities used to sail from Plymouth up the Duxbury marshes, load the gundalow sloop with salt hay, wait for a high tide and a fair wind, raise the mast and sail back to Plymouth. The skipper of this sloop was Parker Hall, afterwards owned by Simpson Burgess.
