

## Car Crashes into Deli

The Deli in Hall's Corner received an expected delivery on Thursday evening when a red van crashed into the front window of the local eatery.

The accident occurred around 7:15 p.m., according to owners Tim and Catherine Callahan who live nearby on Tremont Street.

"The owner of the Wildflower cafe called me and told me there was a car in my front window. I thought he was joking," said Tim Callahan.

The Callahans arrived on the scene as the driver, identified as a male in his 50s or 60s, was being pulled from the vehicle.

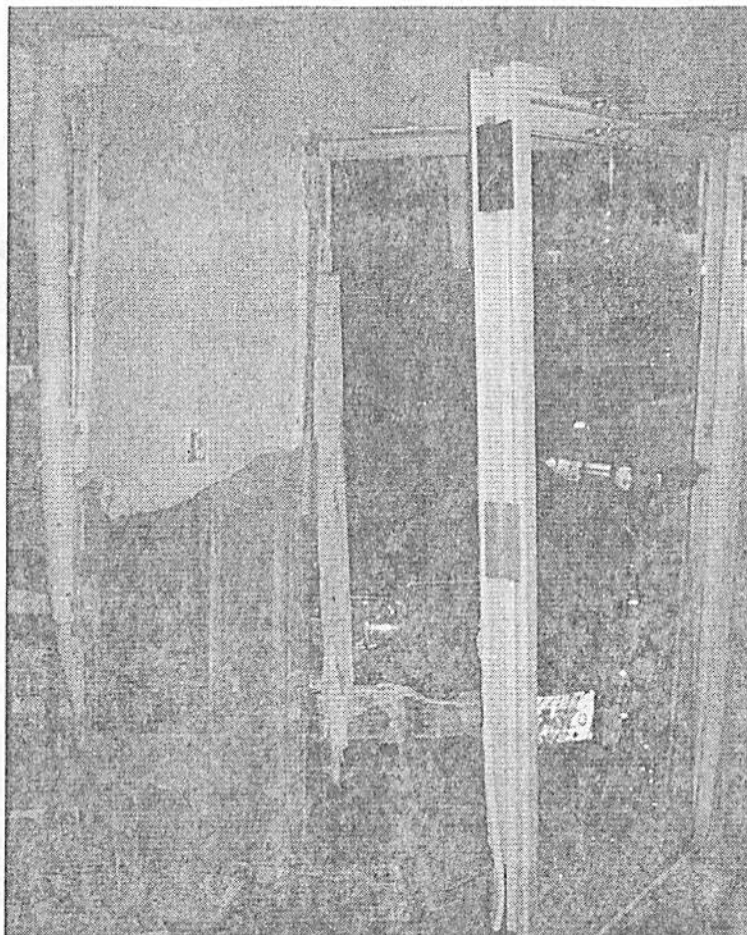
He did not appear injured, but was not able to exit the driver side due to a column blocking the door, according to the Callahans.

Despite the aggravation and the loss of business, the Callahans and their customers have taken it in stride.

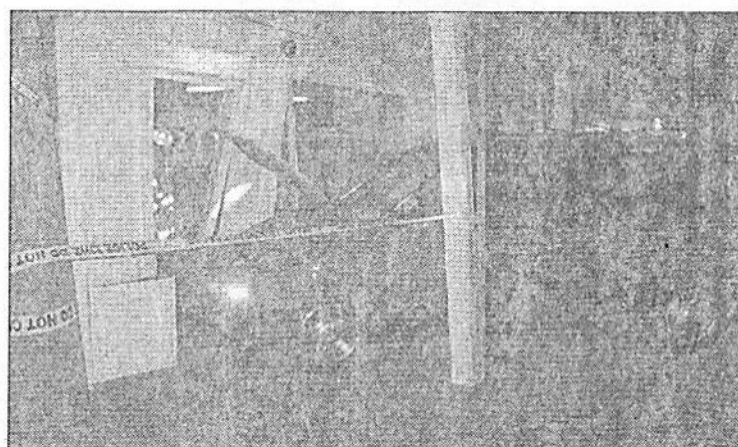
"One customer joked 'this is not the way to go about getting a drive thru,'" said Catherine Callahan.

Callahan praised the police and fire officers who first came on the scene. "They were fantastic," she said.

Observers believe a medical problem may be the cause of the crash. No information has been released by the police on the driver.
