In just five short months, Duxbury's Habitat for Humanity house has gone from a foundation to a building.

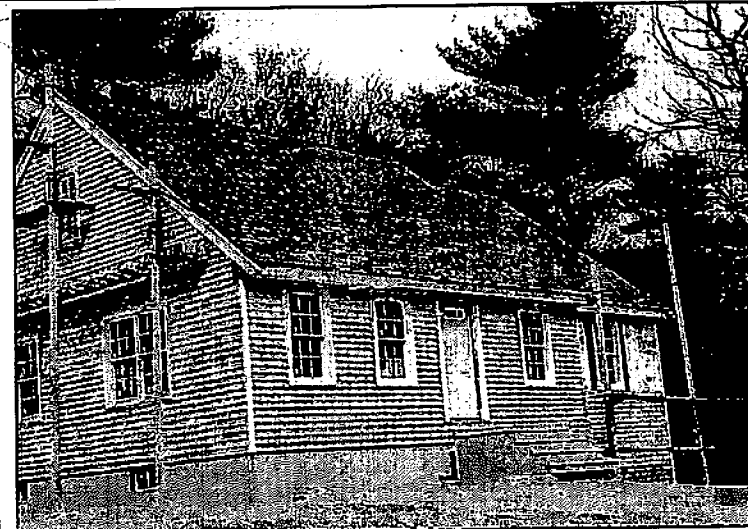
Over 100 volunteers braved the cold Saturdays of winter to push forward with the building project.
