DR. NACE RESIGNS CLAPP LAB POST

Dr. Paul Foley Nace, who came to Duxbury in 1965 as director of Clapp Laboratories, has accepted a new appointment to become professor and chairman of the Faculty of Biology of the University of West Florida, in Pensacola. He will leave in February.

This is a new "upper division" university, which opened this year and which will accommodate graduate students, seniors and juniors. A major interest of the new university will be marine biology, for which two laboratory sites and several laboratory vessels have been obtained.

The administration of the Clapp Laboratories will remain in the hands of Dr. Robert Hillman, who has been serving as assistant director since last summer. He will continue to be aided by associate director, Beatrice Richards of Washington St. Captain Vining A. Sherman and Mrs. Marjorie McMannis will direct the further growth of the fields they now guide at Clapp Laboratories.

Dr. Nace will retain his corporate association with the Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole, where he first worked in 1938. He and Mrs. Nace will occupy their Woods Hole home during vacation periods, and it will be used throughout the year by their children, Ensign Paul Nace, Jr., assigned to the destroyer "Forest Sherman"; Susie Nace, a Manhattanville College graduate in executive training for Jordan Marsh; Kathie Nace, a junior in Manhattanville and Richard Nace, a junior at St. John's Prep.
