

The under 21 Art Show opened in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library on Saturday, May 22, with an evening of music, drama, and poetry readings.

An audience of 75 filled the library to listen to a program featuring the creativity of Duxbury young people. Beginning with a tape of Thomas Hansen playing Beethoven at Recital Hall at the Bosoton Conservatory of Music, the program included such variety as sketches from "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown" and "Alice Through the Looking Glass," songs accompanied by guitars; the lyric soprano of Linda Wadell; readings of Duxbury young people as well as established poets; and a special interpretation of excerpts from Wallace Stevens' poem, "The Blue Guitar," with John Goddard reading and Mark Endresen on the guitar.

Library Gallery To Exhibit Paintings By Town Resident

DUXBURY — An exhibition of paintings by Robinson Murray will open in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Free Library with a reception for the artist from 5 to 7 p.m. tomorrow.

Mr. Murray, a resident of Duxbury, studied drawing and painting at Harvard and also at the Vesper George School of Art in Boston.

After working as a commercial artist for a number of years, he turned to a business career in advertising and became director of the branch office of a large advertising agency in Paris and London, where he lived with his family for seven years.

Upon his retirement from business in 1951, he settled in Duxbury and returned to painting as an occupation. His work has been exhibited in New England and in cities throughout the country, including New York, Boston, Springfield and Hartford.

Mr. Murray is past president of the Art Association, a member of a number of other art groups, and a member of the Copley Society of Boston, where he exhibits regularly.

The Helen Bumpus Gallery is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday. The exhibition will end on July 21.
