Duxbury students receive art show awards

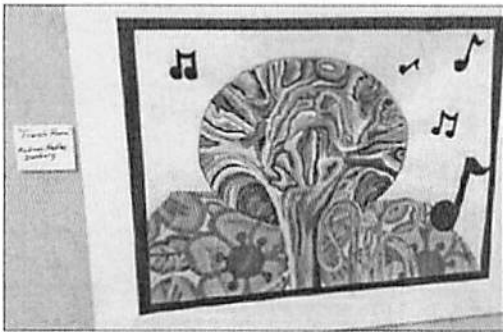
Six Duxbury High School students received awards at the second annual Sixth Plymouth District Student Art Show this year. The art show was open to all high school students in Pembroke, Duxbury, Whitman and Hanson. Selected works from the art show were hung in the historic Doric Hall at the Massachusetts State House.

Among the winners — there were 16 winners in all — was Elizabeth Sheehan, who won Best In Show for her drawing titled, "Leopard." The judges commented that Sheehan's piece was a "lifelike image" and she showed a "beautiful use of materials." Riley Hoff won second place for his drawing titled, "Front Porch." Judges comments included "Amazing technical skill, creative value and texture," and "runner up to best of show." Max Burgess won first place in photography, for his photo titled, "Flow." His piece was described as "contrasting motion versus statue." Judges said they saw a lot of texture in the photo, as well. Connor O'Brien won third place in photography for his piece titled, "Armory — the Ruins." O'Brien's photograph was described as having "very cool perspective and capturing of light." Judges said the "composition and use of neutrals make sparse color gemlike."

Jonas Patroliia won first place for mixed media with his piece, "Maestro." The art show judges said the "great image of conductor materializes from smoke." His piece was also said to have a cool gradient effect with graphic lines.

Carson Hunt tied for third place in mixed media with his piece, "Tranquility," which the judges said had good composition and used perspective well.

Other winners included Brittany Lynch, Hailey Hennessey and Hannah Kemmett of Hanson; Erin O'Leary, Rilee Ellis, Maeline Blandino and Charlotte Bosworth of Pembroke and Miranda Gaquin, Mikaela Burow and Alyssa Johnson of Whitman.
