ART WORKS

Duxbury residents will soon be able to borrow framed reproductions of great works of art in addition to the books, periodicals, and recordings now being circulated by the library.

In announcing the opening of the new service to library users made possible by the regular library budget for 1972, Library Director Janice Neubauer said the many Massachusetts libraries who have established circulating art collections have found that they are greatly appreciated and well-used by their patrons.

The Trustees will display the 29 prints which constitute the week of July 8-13 in the Helen Bumpus Gallery between regularly scheduled gallery exhibitions.

The public is urged to view the new collection during the

week it is being displayed as a whole in the gallery. At this time reserve lists will be started and library users may request specific prints which they may keep for three months. Because the collection is both educational and pleasure-giving, children as well as adults are encouraged to take these out on their library cards. As in the case of all library materials signed out by children, parents are responsible for replacing or paying for any damage.

Library Art Director Gay Youse advised Mrs. Neubauer and Children's Librarian Alice Vautrain in the selection of the prints, which were purchased from New York Graphics.

A New York Graphics catalog, which reproduces in color many of their thousands of reproductions, will be kept on the reference shelves. Patrons may make suggestions for future purchase of prints they would like to see added to the collection. The library's book selection policy will govern the selection of art reproductions, as it does books, periodicals, and recordings.

It has been suggested by the Library Director and the Board of Library trustees that a donation toward the purchase of additional art reproductions would be an excellent gift to the library and especially would constitute a fine memorial gift. Special gift plates would be engraved and placed on the frame.
