### Human rights documentaries

The library has added 12 documentary videos on human rights issues as part of a national library project known as "The Human Rights Video Project," funded through a grant awarded by National Video Resources and The John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. The library and the Anti-Defamation League's "No Place for Hate" campaign, supported by the Duxbury Interfaith Council, applied for this grant last spring to help promote the public's awareness of human rights issues throughout the world.

The videos may be checked out for seven days with a valid library card and can be used for film screenings and discussion groups. Some of the topics are immigration, globalization, political asylum, students' rights, and women's issues. A brochure listing each film with a synopsis and library call number is available at the library and on the library's Web site.
