


"Tiffany, Etc." to Open At Art Complex

Opening July 10 at the Art Complex Museum will be "Tiffany, Etc.," an exhibition featuring a dogwood and wisteria stained glass window by Louis Comfort Tiffany from the museum's permanent collection. An opening reception will be held July 12 from 2 to 5.

The window was originally in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Sanborn in St. Paul, Minn., and was recently acquired by the Art Complex. William Burnham of Wakefield restored the window and examples of his stained glass work will also be on exhibit. Other Tiffany glass will include favrile glass lampshades, a vase, and a multipiece desk set.

Tiffany began his work in glass around 1872 when he became interested in creating objects both useful and beautiful. He enjoyed increasing success until World War I and now Tiffany glass is again popular.

Also on exhibit will be examples of Lutz Glass, Cambridge Amberina, and purple slag from the Emily Winthrop Miles collection.

On exhibit in the Bengtz Gallery is "Gobin Stair: Paintings of Consciousness." Both exhibits continue through Sept. 12. Call 934-6634 for more information.
