

## **Everett Man Arrested for Alleged Break-in at Farfar's Car Chase Ends in Marshfield Harbor**

On August 19, Duxbury police officer Brian Johnson interrupted an apparent breaking and entering at Farfar's Ice Cream Shop on St. George Street. Officer Johnson had been in the area checking nearby businesses on an unrelated matter when he noticed a vehicle pulling away from the closed ice cream shop. "Upon seeing Johnson, the driver of the vehicle accelerated and ran a red light in an attempt to flee the area," stated the police in a press release.

In response, Officer Johnson followed the suspect and radioed Marshfield police for backup.

The driver continued driving toward the Marshfield town pier where his car veered off the road and came to a stop in the harbor.

The suspect, Jarrod Waldon, 35, of Everett, got out of the car on his own accord and was taken into custody by Officer Johnson and a Marshfield officer.

Police were able to confirm that a screen door to Farfar's had been cut. Farfar's owners said that the damage to the screen door had happened after they had closed for the night.

Waldon was uninjured. He was transported to the Duxbury police station and booked and charged with breaking and entering in the nighttime, possession of burglarious tools, malicious destruction of property, refusal to stop for police and several other motor vehicle violations.
