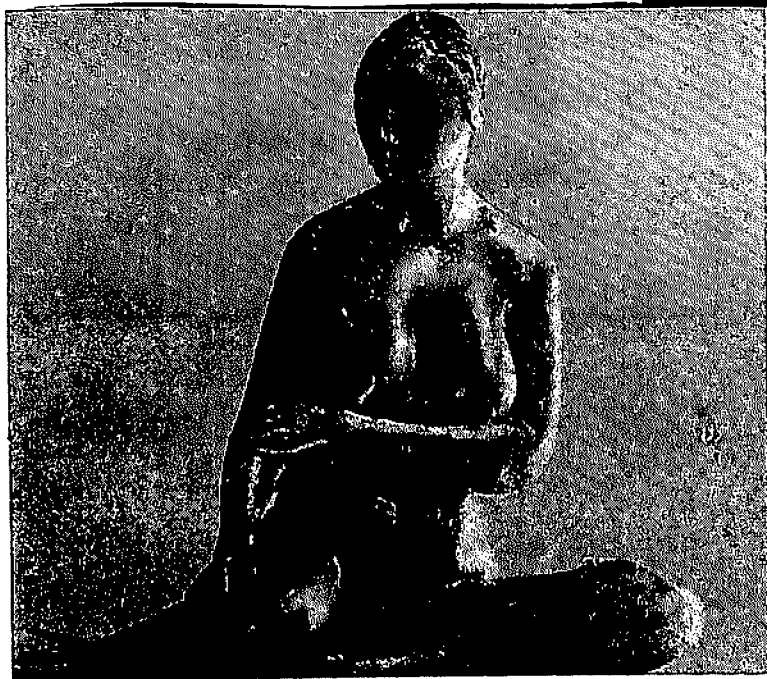

SCULPTURE AT BUMPUS GALLERY

The sculpture and drawings of Marianna Pineda will be exhibited in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library Sept. 29-Oct. 30. The public is invited to meet the artist at the opening Sunday, Sept. 29, from 4-6.

Miss Pineda has studied sculpture with Milles at Cranbrook Academy, Michigan; Morsello at Bennington College, Vt.; Puccinelli at the University of California at Berkeley and Ossip Zadkine in Paris.

Born in Evanston, Ill., she lived in Paris from 1949-1951, Florence, 1954-1957, and Rome, 1966. She now lives in Brookline with her husband, artist Harold Tovish, and her 3 children. She teaches sculpture at Newton College.
