Musical Program For The Winter

Plans are complete for winter musical activities in Duxbury. Bob Cooper, President of the South Shore Choral Society, announced to day that the first rehearsal of the Community Chorus, under the direction of Donald DeLong, will be held Monday at 8 p.m. on Oct. 3, at Duxbury Town Hall (next to the Unitarian Church on Rte. 3A). The tentative program includes two performances of Handel's "Messiah", one in Duxbury, the other in Plymouth. All wishing to join the chorus are urged to attend the meeting so a definite schedule of rehearsals may be worked out. It's not necessary to be a pro to become a member of the chorus—the only requirement is a promise of faithful attendance at weekly rehearsals, for it is impossible for a group of stragglers to do justice to a masterpiece such as Handel's great oratorio.
