Drawing and Prints by Nancy Webb

The Helen Bumpus Gallery on the main floor of Duxbury Free Library will exhibit "Drawing and Prints" by Nancy Webb, an artist from Cambridge, from June 1 through July 31. Many have viewed her bronze tiles at the Alewife T Station and her sculptures near the Galleria Mall in Cambridge. She also presents striking woodcut prints in her children's books. She has taught art in Truro, and has been the art director for Noonan Press in New York City.

"My drawings and prints come from natural forms - insect, fish, flower or vegetable. Quite often I use dead forms - skulls, animal skeletons, dried flowers or bodies of insects...things found in the dump, on the beach or in the compost heap; but my interest

is not simply in the fact that they are dead, leftover, but also in the mysterious power that is retained within these intricate structures," said Webb.
