Navy Plane Crash Lands On Duxbury Beach Aug. 1

On Aug. 1, two Naval officers escaped injury in the late afternoon when their plane made a forced landing in shallow water off Duxbury Beach about a mile from High Pines. The men, who were flying out of the Naval Air Station at South Weymouth, waded ashore from the single-engine propeller-driven craft. They were Lt.-Comdr. Robert Adams of Whitman, the pilot, and Ensign Peter Lauterbach of Rochester, N.Y., his passenger.
