Duxbury's 2 art museums, the Art Complex and the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library, are cooperating to present a combined exhibition of the paintings of Jack Wolfe from Sept. 8 through Oct. 18.

The exhibition will open Sept. 8 with a public reception for the artist at the Art Complex from 8 to 10 p.m. The Helen Bumpus Gallery will also be open Sept. 8 from 7 to 9 p.m. so that the paintings in both galleries may be viewed by those attending the reception.

Jack Wolfe, who lives and works in Stoughton, studied at the Rhode Island School of De-

**BACKGROUND**

His paintings have been exhibited by the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, the Institute of Contemporary Art, the Whitney Museum, the Smithsonian Institute, the American Federation of Arts, the Carnegie Institute, the De Cordova Museum and the Addison Gallery of American Art.

His work is represented in many public and private collections. The paintings exhibited will be those painted from 1968-1973, most of them being shown for the first time...

Artist Nina Bohlen will be present at the opening Sunday, Oct. 28, from 4-6, of an exhibition of her paintings and drawings in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library. The public is invited.

Born in Boston and now living and painting in Brookline, Miss Bohlen is a 1953 graduate of Radcliffe College. She studied painting in 1952 with Hyman Bloom at the Fogg Art Museum and continued to study with him on a private basis. She has

studied sculpture with Frank Stella and Harold Tovish.

She has had one woman exhibitions at the Swetsoff Gallery, the Shore Gallery, the Fragoos Gallery, and the Carl Siembab Gallery of Boston and is currently represented by the Farr Gallery, Madison Avenue, N.Y.C.

Her work is represented in many private collections, including the Gerry Goldberg Collection. The exhibition, selected and arranged by library art supervisor Gay Youse, is scheduled through November.
