Storm causes accidents, outages

Last week's Nor'easter wreaked havoc across town as winds reached 30 miles per hour and rains tore down leaves. The storm hit Duxbury last Wednesday afternoon and as soon as the winds picked up, so did the damage. Road conditions worsened as the Duxbury Fire Department responded to a multiple vehicle car crash on Tremont Street at Harrison. The road was shut down for responders and the fire department warned residents to be aware of slick roads.

enue were shut down due to a downed trees.

By 9:30 p.m. Wednesday night, NStar reported 1,158 Duxbury customers without power, which is about 18 percent of the town. The power outages maxed out at 2,024 (31 percent of the town).

From Wednesday into Thursday, the fire department responded to 16 storm-related calls.

On the bay, boats were pulled loose from the moorings and were blown on shore from the strong winds. The Duxbury Police Department credited the Duxbury harbor master with successfully managing the issues caused by the storm.
