NOTES ON SAQUISH

In the earliest records of the Plymouth Colony, the point of land known as Saquish is called "Sagauas". It is first mentioned in a deed of "the marsh meadow", that is, all the marsh or meadow that is on the island or spot of land commonly called and known by the name of "Sagauas".

Benjamin Hanks, who sold to Lazarus Le Baron in 1746 "All the upland and beach, and meadow and sedge flat and shore to was great-grandfather to Abraham Lincoln," on Saquish.
