Fanny Lydia Davenport (Seymour) Field, 76, died on March 25 at Jordan Hospital. She was the wife of the late Prof. Richard Montgomery Field.

She leaves two brothers, John D. Seymour (husband of Abbie Lewis), of New York City, James D. of London, England; four daughters, Mrs. Martin Eramo (Elizabeth) of New York City, Mrs. C. William Newbury (Joan) of Groton, Conn., Mrs. John Kennedy (Barbara) of Gates Mills, Ohio and Mrs. Frederic Rein (Maryan) of Englewood, N.J. She also leaves 13 grandchildren and five great grandchildren. She also leaves two nieces and two nephews, Ann Seymour of Los Angeles, Calif., William S. Eckert of Lombard, Ill. and Peter and Kathy Seymour.

Born in New York City in 1892, she was married there in 1916. She lived in Jamaica Plain, Providence, R.I. and Princeton, N.J. She spent all of her summers at "Clamavi" on Washington St. except for two summers in Maine and three summers when she rented other houses in Duxbury. She became a year round resident in 1946.

While in Princeton, she served on faculty wives committees for Princeton University, she acted with the Theatre Intime and with the Princeton Community Players, which she helped found. She was active in the Little Club. She attended the Episcopal Church there and the Princeton Chapel. Her father's library (William Seymour) is now at Princeton.

Her late husband's library is at Ohio State University.

In Duxbury she was a member of St. John's Church and its Guild, a sponsor and a staunch supporter of the former Duxbury Playhouse, an active voting citizen (up to the week before she died), a former member of the Duxbury Yacht Club. She was active in many community activities, in entertaining her many friends.

Funeral Services were held at the Church of Saint John the Evangelist on March 27 and Burial was in Mayflower Cemetery.
