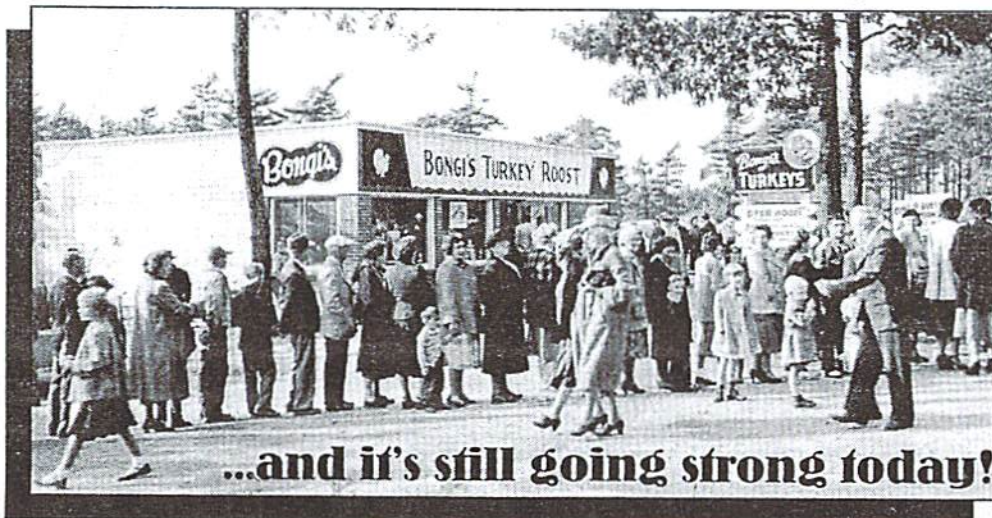

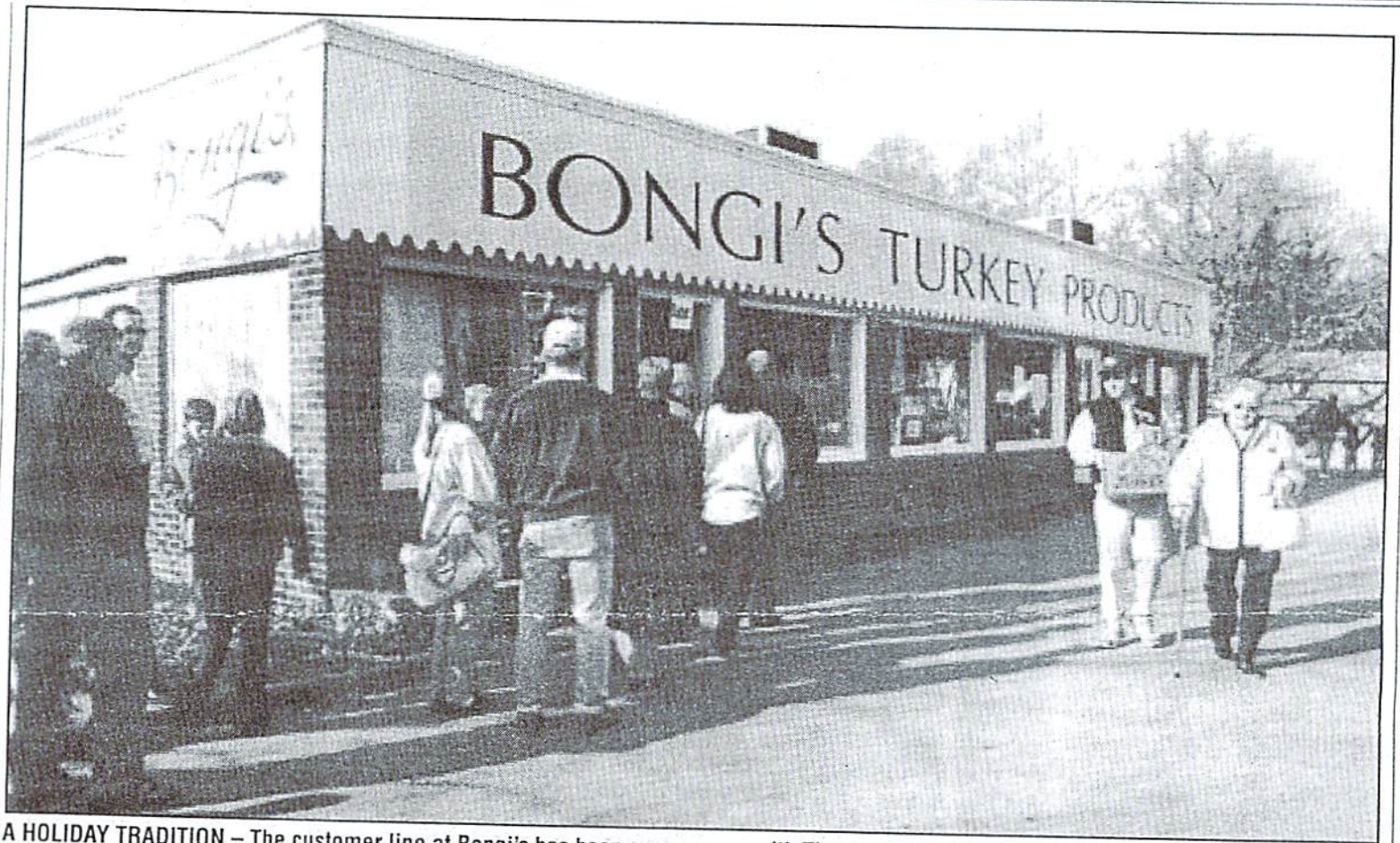

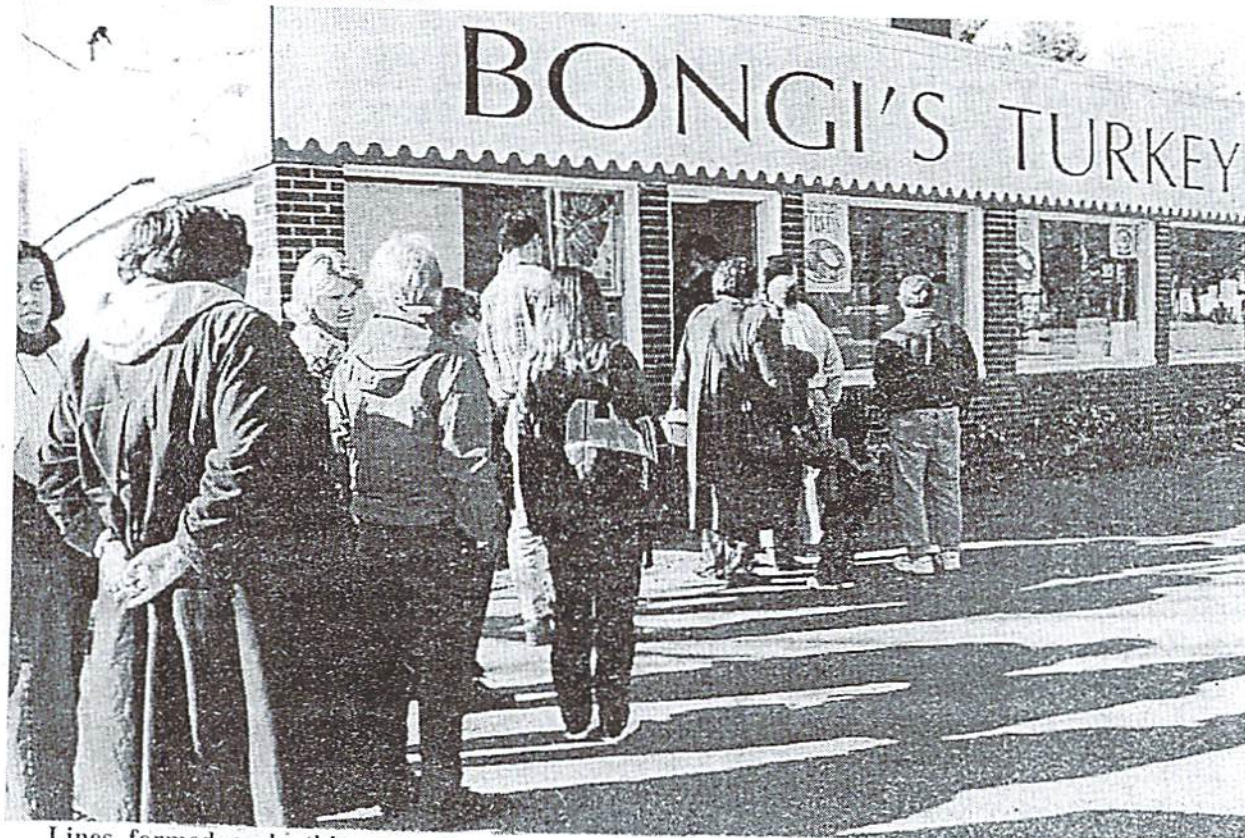

Thanksgiving Signals Special Holiday Business in Town

Things are cookin' around Duxbury this week, particularly at Bongi's, French Memories, Sweet Art, and the Winsor House

Bongi's Turkey Farm heads the list of busy locations this holiday week with 4,000 turkey orders from the family farm on Rte. 53. The business has been in town since 1947 and this week prepared some 900 cooked, stuffed, and frozen birds for pick up Saturday and Sunday. The rest of the week it's strictly a call for the fresh variety for which Bongi's is so famous. Original owners Tony and Anna Bongiorno are still manning the kitchen along with Tom and Marie Pierce and the crew during their busiest time of year. Bongi's expects to sell another 1,000 birds for Christmas.
