NEW EXHIBIT AT LIBRARY

The first solo exhibition of artist Renee Rubin opens Sunday, March 7, in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of Duxbury Free Library. The public is invited to meet the artist at the opening from 3-5.

The exhibition, which will run through April 8, will feature the paintings, drawings, and watercolors of the Newton artist.

Mrs. Rubin attended Mount Holyoke College and graduated from Jackson College, where she majored in history and education. After leaving college her art education became a major part of her life. Through her single-mindedness, this artist has acquired a sound art education. She has studied drawing, design, anatomy, sculpture, and aesthetics, the last 3 at Radcliffe Seminars.

Intimate

Mrs. Rubin's work is on an intimate scale. Her still lifes and landscapes are executed in a gestural manner, which conveys a sensuous enjoyment in not only the subject but in the direct application of paint, pastel, or ink. There seems to be a growing fascination with basic geometric shapes in her still lifes; her landscapes, though distilled by her sensibilities, are more representational. Particularly charming, rich, and unique is the series of landscapes executed in fluid and fluent sepia and sanguine ink wash on rice paper.
