Robert Nathan, a lifelong Duxbury resident, passed away peacefully on Saturday, Jan. 7 at the age of 82.

Bob, the youngest of four children, grew up working in the local family-owned business. The Barnes Market was located in Halls Corner and was a staple in Duxbury for many years. The store was the source of many great memories and stories for Bob and his family. Bob went on to be the owner and operator of Connelly Express, a transportation business for 40-plus years. He enjoyed working and interacting with many of the businesses in Boston and along the Route 3 corridor. Bob, or "Red" as he was often called, a true Duxbury "local," enjoyed earlier days playing tennis and hitting Duxbury beach. Bob enlisted in 1956 and served his country for two years as a specialist in the U.S. Army.
