

## Sewer project wins backing

DUXBURY — The selectmen last night voted unanimously to support a sewer connection project that would link the Upper Alden building, the Percy Walker Pool and the current library to the town's wastewater treatment plant behind the junior-senior high school.

Public Works Director Walter Tonaszuck said the 650-foot pipeline would complete the connection of the town's public buildings to the sewer system.

A two-thirds majority vote at a special town meeting on Oct. 15 is needed to approve the \$122,000 project.

According to Tonaszuck, \$50,000 will go toward connecting the Upper Alden building, which is being converted into a new town library. Linking the pool and the existing library will cost \$55,000. The remaining \$7,000 will pay for construction consultation fees.

Tonaszuck said completing the entire plan at once, rather than breaking it down into two or three individual projects, would be more cost effective. He added that the construction was fairly simple and would take about 3 weeks to complete.
