TURE BENGTZ WILL SPEAK

Finnish-born artist Ture Bengtz will present a gallery talk in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library this evening, April 16, at 8. He will discuss his work and procedures, the technique of lithography and the stained glass window he designed for a 12th century church in Finland.

Mr. Bengtz, whose paintings, drawings and lithographs are being exhibited in the library gallery until May 2, has had a great deal of experience in teaching and lecturing as well as being noted for his artistic achievements. He began teaching at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston in 1934, and in 1941 he became head of the Drawing and Graphic Arts department there, a position he held until becoming director of the Duxbury Art Complex, scheduled to open this summer.

HAD TV PROGRAM

For seven years from 1951-1957 he conducted his own summer school, "The Bengtz School of Art" in Lenox, Mass., and he has lectured and demonstrated extensively on the art of drawing, composition, anatomy, painting and printmaking. Local residents may remember the television series "Bengtzt on Drawing," demonstration and lectures on drawing and anatomy shown on Channel 2 from 1957-1960.

The public is invited to meet the artist.
