Police catch unregistered sex offender repossessing car

Police responding to an argument about a car repossession found more than they bargained for, — an unregistered sex offender.

Police were called to a residence on Kingstown Way around 2:25 a.m. on Nov. 29, according to Lt. Lewis Chubb of the Duxbury Police Department. The homeowner was embroiled in a dispute with two men from a repossession company who were trying to take a car.

The parties had peacefully settled their dispute before police arrived, said Chubb. However, during a routine check of the two employees it was discovered that one of them, Joseph Nardone Jr., 36, was an unregistered sex offender. Police arrested him for failure to

register as a sex offender.

Nardone is listed as a Level 2 sex offender, according to Chubb. His last known address was in Revere, but he has not lived there for some time and failed to provide authorities with a new address, Chubb said. Nardone had been homeless for sometime but told police he was planning on moving to Boston.

Sex offenders are required to provide an updated address every three months.

Nardone was released on \$40 bail at 6:55 a.m., according to the arrest log.

According to the state's sex offender registry, there are three level 2 and one level 3 sex offenders currently living in Duxbury.

Teen arrested for OUI

A Bridgewater man was arrested and charged with operating under the influence of drugs and alcohol after a traffic stop.

On Nov. 27, around 2:30 a.m., a police officer observed a car driving erratically on Tremont Street and pulled the driver over, according to Lt. Lewis Chubb of the Duxbury Police.

Police arrested Seamus Murtagh, 18, of Bridge Street in Bridgewater, and charged him with OUI drugs, OUI liquor and marked lanes violation, according to police.
