Duxbury Art Exhibit Opens

DUXBURY — A one-man exhibition of sculpture and drawings of Lloyd Lillie opened yesterday in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library with the public meeting the artist.

Mr. Lillie, a resident of Newton, is an associate professor of art at Boston University. His most recent exhibitions have been at Colby College, Maine, and the Sculptors' Guild of New York. Some of his work is now being shown as part of the Faculty

Exhibit at Boston University.

The exhibition includes casts of the portraits of Andrew Carnegie and Joseph Pulitzer, which he created on commission for the American Museum of Immigration at the Statue of Liberty.

The exhibition, scheduled through Dec. 6, was selected and arranged by Miss Gay Youse, library art director. Gallery hours are from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays and 2 to 5 p.m. Sundays.

Lillie works on exhibit in Duxbury

A one-man exhibition of the sculpture and drawings of Lloyd Lillie will open in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library on Sunday, Nov. 5. The public is invited to meet the artist at the opening from four to six p.m.

Lillie, a resident of Newton, is an associate professor of art at Boston University. He has studied at the Corcoran School of

Art, Washington, D.C., Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculptures, Boston Museum School, and the Accademia di Belle Arti, in Florence, Italy.

His most recent exhibitions have been at Colby College, Maine, and the Sculptors' Guild of New York. Some of his work is now being shown as part of the Faculty Exhibit at Boston University.

The exhibition, scheduled from Nov. 5 through Dec. 6, has been selected and arranged by Library Art Director, Gay Youse. Gallery hours are: Weekdays, 10-9, Saturdays, 10-6, and Sundays, 2-5.
