AUTOMOBILE FATALITY

Alice Wall, 15, of North Plymouth, was killed shortly after 3 p.m. on June 15 and two companions were injured when the convertible in which they were riding overturned near the intersection of Tremont and Alden streets.

Police said the car was traveling south on Tremont St. at "Deadman's Curve" when it swerved to the left, hit an embankment and tipped back into the road.

Miss Wall, who was riding alone in the back seat of the car, was pronounced dead at the scene by Medical Examiner Dr. William Gould of Kingston.

Sgt. Henry McNeil listed Paula Aguiar, 15, of Plymouth, as the driver of the car. She was treated for scrapes and bruises at Jordan Hospital.

Kathleen Ruppert, 15, of Plymouth, was also treated for minor injuries. A fourth person in the car, Charles Smith, 15, of Plymouth, did not require hospital treatment.

David H. Botelho, 21, of Plymouth, was listed by police as the owner of the car.
