

## At The Bumpus Gallery

An exhibition featuring contemporary styles of artists Calvin Burnett and Art Wood will be shown in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library from Aug. 14 to Sept. 16.

Mr. Burnett, who lives in West Newton, is a professor at Massachusetts College of Art in Boston. He is the author and designer of the book "Objective Drawing Techniques" published in 1966 by Reinhold, as well as an illustrator for books and periodicals. His work has appeared in national and international group exhibitions and in one man shows in the U.S. His work is in the following collections: Albert Wiggins Collection in the Boston Public Library, the Fogg Museum, the Museum of Fine Arts, Wellesley College, Howard and Atlanta Universities, Oakland Museum and in many private collections.

### HIS BACKGROUND

Art Wood of the Boston area is an associate professor at the Rhode Island School of Design and has worked as a free lance book illustrator and print maker. His prints are in private collections and in the collections of the Museum of Modern Art, Boston Museum of Fine Arts, Fogg Museum and Brandeis University. Last year he started a puppet workshop at the Rhode Island School of Design and created a puppet and people theater, the Elm Seed Theatre, at the Old Cambridge Baptist Church in Cambridge. He has lately returned from the state of Washington where his Elm Seed Theatre presented a puppet play using 8-foot Indian puppets created by the artist.

Both artists have appeared recently on television. Burnett took part in a sound-off discussion of the black artist and

society, and Wood presented excerpts of his Elm Seed Theatre puppet play "Afternoon, Hayes-Bickford" in a program concerning the problems of the aged.

The Elm Seed Theatre puppet play for adults featuring Wood's 8-foot puppets will be presented Sept. 16 at 8 p.m. The public is invited to the play and to a reception for the two artists.
