Some Fine Views of Historic Duxbury

✕✕ Can be seen from the private boarding house of MRS. J. F. BANISTER,
 ✕✕ at South Duxbury, near the shore. Abreast of this house, in the
 ✕✕ bay, is Clark's Island, under whose protecting shelter the Mayflower
 ✕✕ lay the Sabbath before the landing on Plymouth Rock. To the right
 ✕✕ of the Island the Gurnet Lights are to be seen. At this point of land
 ✕✕ it is thought by eminent historians that Thorwald, the Norse explorer,
 ✕✕ was buried, 1003. A fort was built here in 1776 called Fort Standish.
 ✕✕ Shots were not unsuccessfully exchanged from this fort with the
 ✕✕ British frigate Niger. During the Rebellion this fort was renamed
 ✕✕ Fort Andrew. The first lighthouse was built here in 1768. Within
 ✕✕ sight of this popular house are also the original farms of Myles
 ✕✕ Standish, Elder Brewster and John Alden. All who are looking for a
 ✕✕ quiet home during the heated term, should call on Mrs. Banister.
