

FORD'S STOREYEAR

- 1712 (Bk.11 p.32) Samuel Fisher sells to Ichabod Bartlett his farm of forty acres in Duxbury, formerly the lands of Peter West, bounded by the road from Marshfield to Duxbury, on the southeast, from the mill brook to the head of the lane to the south of Fisher's house, thence bounded by Mr. Southworth's land to the path that goes from Dr. Delano's to Deacon Alden's, thence by said path to another path, to the place where Peter West formerly dwelt. thence.....to a small tree standing near the mill brook and on the same line to the brook, thence bounded by the brook till it comes to the first-mentioned bound, together with all housing and fencing appertaining thereto.
- 1740 (Bk.34 p.29) Seth Bartlett (son of Ichabod?) sells to Dr. Eleazar Harlow his farm (referring for title to deed above) of forty acres, bounded on the north by the Grist-mill Pond or Brook, on the east by the road and land of Mr. Southworth, on the south by the road that leads to Deacon Alden's from Powder Point, and on the west by land of Joseph Simmons and Pelatiah West, to the pond or brook.
- 1811 (Prob. Bk. 39 p.301) Inventory of the estate of Gideon Harlow, son of Dr. Eleazar Harlow: among other parcels of real estate,
" one dwelling house and two shops without land, \$1630.00; two-thirds of a small house with the land it stands on, \$75.00"
- 1812 (Prob. Bk.44 p.360) Inventory of the estate of Dr. Eleazar Harlow;
"Homestead in Duxbury, 34 acres and barn, \$510.00"
- 1813 (Bk.121 p.130) Asaph and Thomas Harlow, sons of Dr. Eleazar Harlow, quitclaim all their interest in the estate of Dr. Eleazar in Duxbury to Abner and Gideon Harlow, sons of Gideon Harlow.

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- 1813 (Bk.121 p.128 and 130) Two division deeds by the heirs of Gideon and Dr. Eleazar Harlow. The homestead of Dr. Eleazar Harlow was divided between Abner and Eleazar, sons of Gideon: the dividing line only is given, no boundaries. On Gideon's estate, Eleazar took "the whole of the hatter's shop which he now occupies", and Abner took "all the dwelling house in which he now lives, together with the saddler's shop near the same".
- 1813 (Bk.121 p.86) Abner Harlow to the Duxbury Woolen and Cotton Mfg. Co. (one month after the division deed above)"Tract of land on my homestead farm and all buildings: thirty three acres, more or less. (See map for boundaries of this tract.) The description begins the boundaries north of Eleazar's hatter's shop.
- 1818 (Bk.138 p.190) Eleazar Harlow sells to James T. Ford 57 rods of land with the hat shop standing thereon: part of the homestead farm of the late Dr. Eleazar Harlow.
- 1819 (Bk.139 p.70) Eleazar Harlow sells to James T. and Nathaniel Ford 14 acres and the buildings thereon: this is the remainder of the part of Dr. Eleazar's homestead that Eleazar took on division.
- 1844 (Bk.213 p.113) Duxbury Cotton and Woolen Factory sells to Gershom, Alden, and Ezra Weston the mill dam and mill privilege, and the woolen factory and all other buildings, all fixtures and machinery, rights of flowage, etc. Boundaries same as in deed of Abner Harlow to Ezra Weston et al. in 1812.

Also about thirty acres of land on west side of brook: boundaries same as in deed of Abner Harlow to Duxbury Company in 1813, together with house, barn, store, and all other buildings.

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Also about nine acres of land deeded by Rufus Weston to said Company in 1823.

"It is not understood that the store of J.T.Ford & Co. standing on the premises above-named is not conveyed by this instrument."

1863 (Bk.316 p.171) Alden B. Weston sells to George W. Ford the three parcels above.
