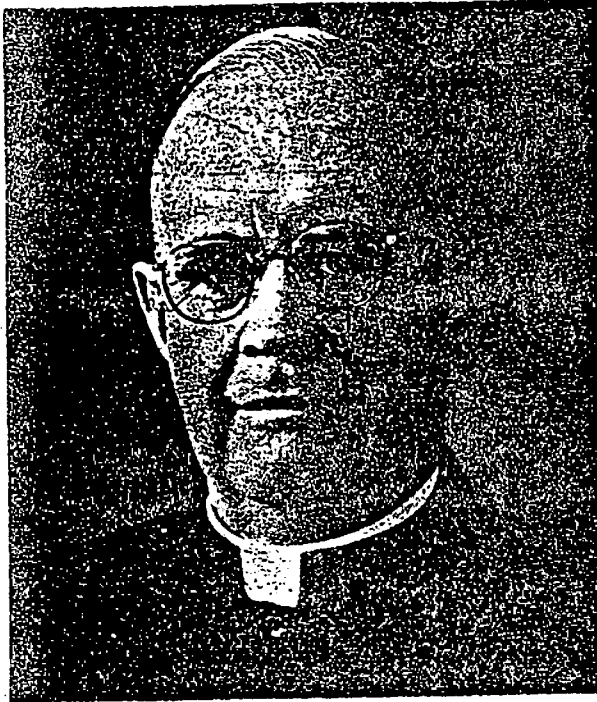

Father Howard's successor as pastor of Holy Family Church will be the Rev. John Cosgrove. Born in Scotland in 1906, Father Cosgrove studied at St. John's Seminary in Brighton, Mass., and was ordained in 1936 at the Cathedral by William Cardinal O'Connell. He was Assistant Parish Priest at St. Mark, Dorchester and at St. Andrew in Forest Hills before becoming Chaplain at Assumption Academy in Wellesley. Since 1937 he has served as Assistant Parish Priest at St. Anthony, Cohasset; Assumption, East Boston; St. Joseph, Wakefield; St. Rita, Lowell; Immaculate Conception in Stoughton and St. Clement in Somerville.
